Theories of Public Policy

Over the years political science, like other scientific disciplines (fields), has developed a number of concepts and models to help us understand political life. The purpose of these is to :

- <sup>Y</sup> .Identify important political forces in society.
- $\gamma$  .Communicate relevant knowledge about political life.
- <sup>2</sup> .Direct inquiry into politics.
- ° .Suggest explanations for political events and outcomes .

Throughout this course we shall try to see whether the concepts and models of political scientists have any utility (effectiveness, usefulness) in the study of public policy. Specifically to examine public policy from the perspective (viewpoint, angle) of:
